State of Virginia, Charlotte County Court.

On the 3^d day of September 1862 personally appeared in open Court before the County Court of Charlotte now sitting, Daniel Kendrick resident of the County and State aforesaid, aged 20 years, who being first duly sworn answering to his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1862

That he served seven tours in the militia of Virginia during the Revolutionary war, when he first entered the service, he entered it as a volunteer, being then too young to be regularly enrolled, he resided at that time in the County of Amelia in the State of Virginia where he continued to reside throughout the war. He cannot recollect the dates of his entering the service, or of leaving it, but he recollects that he was under the command of Capt. Paulin Brandon at Charlotte Court house, Va., he was at sea James River, or near it, under the command of Col. Brooker, Capt. Wm. Binney. he was on James River at Manns ferry and other places under the command of Col. Henry St. John & Gen. Lawson. he was at Guilford sea Court house, under Gen. Lawson, Col. Beverly Randolph & Capt. Robert Gordon. he was at North Hills on James River under Gen. Lawson, Col. Henry St. John & William Trimmey Capt. - his memory has become very defective, ^{as he can fix the length of time he served the his opponent that he served} ^{there are many officers under whom} whose names he cannot now recollect. he does not recollect that he ever received a discharge.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatsoever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State

Madam:

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 8706 it appears that Daniel Hendrick was born November 18, 1761 in Amelia County, Virginia, where he lived until three or four years after the Revolution.

He enlisted in 1776 and served four months as a private in Captain Paulding Anderson's Company, Colonel William B. Giles' Virginia Regiment.

He enlisted in 1780 and served three months in Captain *Finney's* ~~Company~~ ^{Company} under Colonels Booker and Henry Skipwith in the Virginia Troops, then enlisted late in 1780 and served three months as private in Captain Robert Hudson's Company, Colonel Beverly Randolph's Virginia Regiment; was in the battles of Rameour's Mill and Guilford Court House.

He enlisted in 1781 and served three months as private in Captain William Finney's Company, Colonel Henry Skipwith's Virginia Regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application executed Sep-

tember 3, 1832 while a resident of Charlotte County, Virginia.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to Daniel Hendrix, or Hendrix, and the above noted is the only soldier by a similar name found on said records. He signed by mark.
