Fleming Saunders and of the Judges of the General Court, and Judge of the Superior Court of Law of the County of Pittsylvania, in the sixth Judicial Circuit, do hereby certify that the above attestation of William Turnbull Clerk of the said Superior Court of Law, is in due form, given under my hand and seal this 4th Day of October 1819. —

At a Superior Court of Law convened and held for Pittsylvania County and the 1st Day of October 1819. —

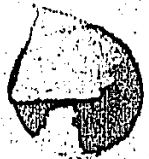
Obediah Hendrick of the County of Charlotte aged about nearly three years, personally appeared in Court, and being sworn made the following Declaration, in order to obtain the provisions made by the last act of Assembly entitled, "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" That the said Obediah Hendrick enlisted for the Term of three years, in the year 1777, in the County of Charlotte in this State, in the Company commanded by Captain Thomas Smith of Prince Edward County, of the third Georgia Regiment commanded by Colonel Albert and the Continental establishment. That he continued in the service of the United States upwards of two years. That he was in the battles of Plover Creek in the State of Georgia, and Johns Island in the twenty miles of Charleston, That in July 1779, his term of service ended, he received from Major Oleson at Parsons Bridge in South Carolina a discharge for the balance of the said term, That he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support. —

Major Richard Johnson of this County came into Court and being sworn deposed that he is acquainted with the above named Obediah Hendrick, and that the same is true to his mind of truth. —

Griffith Dickenson, also came into Court, and made oath, That he saw the above named Obediah Hendrick enlist in the public service of the United States during the Revolutionary War, in the County of Charlotte in this State, about the month of March 1777, for the term of three years with Captain Thomas Smith of Prince Edward County of the first Company of the third Georgia Battalion, That he marched with said Hendrick to the State of Georgia, where he was commanded by Colonel Albert, Kerstien and others and that he knows of said Hendrick's being in the service two years and upwards. —

William Junot's Clerk of this Court, deposed in open Court that he has been well acquainted with the above named Griffith Dickenson for a number of years, that he considers him to be a highly respectable Citizen, and that such is his general Character. —

Whereupon it appearing to the Court that the said Obediah Hendrick was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War to fight against the common enemy — that he served upwards of one year and upwards and that he is in necessitous circumstances and needs the assistance of his Country, It is ordered that the foregoing Declaration be certified to the War Department. —

The undersigned, that at a Court held for Lunenburg County the 15th day of May 1831, personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for the said County as declared by Law Charles Hendricks aged 65 years, resident in the County and District aforesaid, who being first duly sworn according to Law, with an oath declared that he was in the revolutionary war as follows, that he enlisted in Captain Thomas Smith's Company of the third Regiment, served upward of two years, and the date of his original declaration was the first of October 1819, in Pittsylvania County, and the number of his certificate is 16-417. That he was furnished (By George Moore of Brunswick County) for the balance of his terms & schedule of of Long Estate as follows, and horse bridles and saddle worth \$30. One cow and calf \$10. one sow and pig's six dollars two pots and one Oven \$10 two hoes and two axes \$10. One safe and Chest \$10. One old down \$10. six plates, six six chairs and a white \$10. three hand saws, two Chains, Sledge, double drawing knife, two planes and four Angles \$10 - 2 flint and four \$10. —

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 15th day of March 1818, and that I have not, since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of any property or any part thereof, with intent thereby or to circumvent or act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war professed on the 15th day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor have any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts, or debts due to me, nor have I any — come other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by an endorsement to the number of my family is myself, and wife about the age of sixty five years. One daughter about 40 years of age, two grand children girls about the ages of sixteen years the other about the age of six or seven years.


