I William Hill Secretary of State in and for the State of North Carolina, do hereby certify, that it appears of record in this Office, that a warrant for bounty land was issued for the services of William Lesley a private soldier of the Continental line of this State in the revolutionary war, for two hundred and seventy four Acres (274 acres) the quantity of land allowed by law to a private soldier who served three years.

Which warrant was issued on the certificate of a Field Officer and is No 4525, dated 24th Decr. 1796.

Declarations

In order to obtain the benefit of the act
of Congress passed the 4th July 1830 -

On this 20th of May 1844 personally appeared
before the undersigned an acting Justice of the
Peace in and for said County Daniel Lashley
aged 64 years, whose name is well known, according
to his oath on his oath made the following
Declaration in order to obtain the benefit
of the provision made by the 3rd section of
the act of Congress passed the 4th July 1830

That he is the son of William
Lashley who was a soldier of the Revolution
and served 3 years in Capt. Blewett
and Capt. John McCreary's Company -
that he always understood his father the
said Mr Lashley enlisted under Capt.
Blewett, and he afterwards joined Capt.
John McCreary's Company and served out
his 3 years term of military service - that
he returned ^{to the army} in the year 1780, & he has
frequently heard him say - that his father
was legally married in the County of Wake
in the year 1749 to Mary Medlin that
they were married some number of months
before he left home to join the army &
that he ~~is~~ ^{is} the declarant, was born in the
year 1780 during his father's absence
in the service - that his father the said
Mr Lashley died in the year 1817 aged
60 years, and that his mother Mary
Lashley formerly Mary Medlin died

on the 20th day of February 1837 in the County
of Wake in the 80th year of her age, her
age and that of the father of this Deceased
thing nearly equal - all which will
more fully appear by reference to the
witnesses annexed Dan Loshly
